# What is the Fuel Assistance Program?

Fuel Assistance is a seasonal program designed to help eligible households afford the high cost of heating their homes. Tri County CAP receives federal LIHEAP funds through the State of New Hampshire

Governor's Office of State Planning & Energy. The most vulnerable households, those with elderly or disabled members, or families with young children, are prioritized. Each household

must complete an application, providing information about each household member and income documentation. This information is confidential, and is used to determine eligibility and amount of assistance. Once a household has been determined to be eligible, a credit is established on their behalf. We can pay for delivered heating fuels, as well as electricity and rent when heat is included. Payments are made directly to the vendor when bills are submitted to our office. Vendors selling oil, wood, kerosene, coal, propane or electricity enroll by signing a formal agreement to participate in the program.

The program generally begins around December 1st and ends April 30th each year.



**Income is generally reviewed for the 30 day time period prior to the application date. In some cases, we must review income documentation for one year. Please contact our office for the annual income limit figures. Benefit levels this year can range from \$150 to \$1,125, depending on income level and annual heating costs.**
