The tentative plan is meet at 4:30 on the Green. Shocked to see that this information was edited out by the Editorial board of the Dartmouth. This was necessary information.

I will bring signs and encourage friends to make signs as well.

4:30 meet, Short speech on the threats posed by a Trump administration (invigorated state violence or negligent law enforcement in cases of hate crimes, nuclear rearmament, scaling back Medicaid and Medicare, harassment of free speech and free press, state sponsored discrimination in the form of the Muslim ban, building a wall on the Mexican border as well as the accompanying rhetoric of "mexicans are rapists, drug dealers", defunding public education, ignoring science of climate change etc)

followed by a "discussion on what rights are threatened by the incoming administration, what steps we can take to ensure that they are not simply taken away and what burning an American flag might achieve."

Possibly we would burn the American flag, if there is enough support among those attending. This altogether should take no more than 1 hour.

Attendance: I expect no more than 50 people. Perhaps it might be a good idea to have a bullhorn, but I do not expect all that many people, because this article has come out so late and without Time of the meeting.

Counterdemonstration: That of course if a possible factor, but again because it is being called for so late I don't anticipate a significant counterdemonstration to form. I expect more than anything apathy from students and community members. Course of action in the case of a counter demo would be to carry on peacefully and to avoid direct confrontations with another mass of people. All are welcome at the meeting/discussion however, so any counterdemonstration would in effect be demonstrating against democratic dialogue and free speech.
